Absence from School

Parent/Carers will have received an email from school with information from the NHS about Covid-19, symptoms and testing.

Please take time to read this useful document carefully. The information is also available in the school news section of our website.

If your child is absent from school for any reason, you must phone the school on 0208 997 0619 and leave a message on the absence line (option 1) before 9.00am. Please include your child's name, class and reason for absence. If your child is ill, please briefly describe any symptoms they may have, such as a sore throat, high temperature etc.

Where possible, appointments should be made after school, such as non-urgent dentist etc. Please can you inform the school, in advance, of any appointments your child needs to attend, if they are happening during the school day. We will ask to see appointment letters, text messages etc.

Covid-19 Symptoms—What to look out for.

A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH

A NEW CONTINUOUS COUGH MEANS:

- you are coughing a lot for more than 1 hour
- OR
- you have been coughing a lot 3 or more times in 24 hours
- if you normally have a cough, it may be worse than usual.



The coronavirus cough is a dry cough. This means it does not produce any phlegm or mucus (so you do not cough anything up like you would with a chesty cough).

If you have a chest condition you may already cough. If you have symptoms of coronavirus, you may have a cough that is different from your normal cough, or your normal cough may feel worse than usual.

WHAT TO DO:

- rest
- drink lots of fluids



A HIGH TEMPERATURE OR FEVER

A high temperature or fever is a normal way for your body to fight infection.

This is because the increase in body temperature makes it harder for viruses and bacteria to survive.



You do not need to take your temperature to know you have a fever.

If you do have a thermometer however, a fever is when your temperature is 37.8C or higher.



A THIRD COMMON SYMPTOM OF CORONAVIRUS IS A LOSS OF, OR CHANGE IN, SENSE OF SMELL OR TASTE (ANOSMIA).

Blue Badge School Streets Information

All blue badge holders can apply for an exemption, it is a national scheme to provide those with additional requirements the ability to park as close to their intended destination as possible.

Blue badge holders will receive dispensation to exempt them from the school street restrictions, provided that they are a blue badge holder themselves, a parent or guardian of a child with a blue badge attending the school in a Street School.
